AUTUMN TERM 2017

English:

During the Autumn Term we will study different text types including narrative, fables, myths and legends, dialogues and plays, letters and poetry. We will look at various spelling conventions and punctuation using commas, question marks, exclamation marks and inverted commas (speech marks).

We will continue to develop the children's understanding of spelling patterns, with a focus on the 200 High Frequency Words. We will also extend knowledge of grammar and punctuation.

Mathematics:

Children will develop their fluency in maths. We will revise place value and explore further the number operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We will also look at problem solving, 2D shape and statistics.

Children will be tested on number bonds and times tables each week

Science:

Our science topics this term are 'Forces and Magnets' and 'Rocks and Soils'. Children will have the opportunity to carry out practical investigations and to analyse results and draw conclusions.

French:

The children will be introduced to French language and culture with Madame Craston on Friday mornings.

Computing:

The children will learn key computing skills and how to use the internet safely. We will be looking at authoring which will allow children to design a PowerPoint presentation based on their history topic.

R.E:

The children will consider the influence of rules on actions within school and in society.

We will focus on learning about festivals and important places and features of Islam.

P.E.:

The children will be having games, dance and gymnastic sessions this term. Outdoor PE will be led by Mr Williams from 'All for Sport'.

History and Geography

This term we are exploring the time before written history, known as pre-history. By learning about life in the Stone Age through to the Iron Age, children are able to compare and contrast the lives of human communities through time.
