

SPORT PREMIUM FUNDING 2016-2017

Sport Premium funding, also known as Olympic Legacy funding, for Physical Education and School Sport was announced by the government in March 2013. This substantial sum of £150m per year is going directly to schools. The 'ring-fenced' funding – only to be spent on PE and sport – will be given to the schools, who will decide what is best for their children's needs with the aim of improving the quality of provision in every state primary school in England.

Here at Reedings Junior School the funding has been used directly to develop the provision of Sport and PE throughout the school.

We have developed a strategic plan based on:

1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. increased participation in competitive sport

The impact of this funding will be measured through:

- pupil perception questionnaires measuring the interest of children in different areas of PE and Sport;
- direct feedback by teachers on the quality of support offered by the specialist;
- feedback from the specialist teachers to the PE Coordinator and/or Head Teacher on the level of engagement by teachers;
- the increase in the number of children engaging in inter school sporting activities;
- the number of children representing the school in a competitive environment;
- the number of children attending a sports club either in school or outside.

Reedings Junior School has used Sports Premium funding to:

- ✓ Train teachers to deliver high quality gymnastics
- ✓ Ensure that the PE coordinator is highly skilled and has a secure understanding of the subject requirements
- ✓ Buy into the local Sports Partnership and local Sports Cluster
- ✓ Provide teachers with high quality teaching resources
- ✓ Support inactive children by running targeted clubs for them to attend
- ✓ Further develop the skills of Gifted and Talented children in PE
- ✓ Enable more children to participate in local competitions
- ✓ Raise the profile of PE by helping to secure a Silver Games Mark Award
- ✓ Purchase new outdoor gym equipment to further enhance and encourage healthy lifestyles

With the next allocation we will:

- ✓ Continue to buy into the local Sports Partnership
- ✓ Provide teachers with a new and up to date internet platform for teaching dance and gymnastics
- ✓ Provide teachers with a number of CPD opportunities
- ✓ Continue to support the PE coordinator to ensure high quality leadership of PE
- ✓ Sponsor a sports apprentice
- ✓ Employ a range of sports coaches to encourage new skills and provide CPD
