Spelling

Purple mash – You will continue to be set to-dos to practise different spelling patterns. Try to record any words you do not spell correctly and then you can practise them throughout the week.

Science

So far, we have learned about the different parts of a flower and how they are used for pollination. This week, your task is about seed dispersal. Once the seed is fertilised, there are 5 ways it can be sent on its way before it reaches the ground to grow. Your task is to find out what those methods of dispersal are and show them using a diagram for each. In each example, try to name and draw the seed. Some seeds have unique features for this! Show them and explain how they work. Finally, answer this question under your diagram: **Why is seed dispersal important in the lifecycle of a plant?**

Geography

Using the Ordnance Survey website from last week, look at the symbols at this link:

On Google maps, find the local area around Sawbridgeworth. Your task is to draw a map of the local area and include symbols for some of the places and landmarks. Also include some roads and rivers. Can you use any of the official symbols? If not, create your own symbol for it! Remember to put a key showing your symbols. Examples of places to include are: school, hospital, park, train station, fire station and so on. It is up to you to decide the scale of the map and how much you are zoomed in.

On Monday there is a BBC Bitesize lesson about the Vikings which will be good revision for you.

Think about how you believe the world was created.


Create an animation for this.
