




# Reedings Junior School Survey Results

## Parent Survey Autumn 2020

Thank you for those of you who completed the parent survey sent via 'survey monkey' in the Autumn Term. 94 out of a potential 242 responses from 221 families were received. Your feedback is important as it helps us improve our offer and make our school an even better place to learn.

### Q1: MY CHILD IS HAPPY AT SCHOOL



As we would expect, Reedings is a happy place to be and 96% of parents feel their children are happy at school. This is in line with the findings of the Autumn 2019 parents survey results.


Positive mental health and well-being is one of the school's priorities and will remain so for the foreseeable future.

Due to the pandemic, two families felt their children did not feel safe. This was detailed in the comments option given for this question. This result is also in line with the previous survey undertaken before the pandemic. This is a hugely positive result and demonstrates that the work the school and parents at home are putting in to support children and reassure them, is working and should continue.

### Q2: MY CHILD FEELS SAFE AT SCHOOL




### Q3: MY CHILD HAS SETTLED BACK INTO SCHOOL AFTER LOCKDOWN






# Reedings Junior School Survey Results

Only 1 family disagreed that their child had settled back into school, but a staggering 93 parents felt their child had. Again, a hugely positive result and an indication that the work that has taken place to support children recover lost learning and their mental health and well-being has been successful and clearly must continue.



The vast majority of parents agree the school has high expectations of their children and these results, in line with the Autumn 2019 survey.

The curriculum at Reedings and our curriculum expectations are currently under review and are being articulated and re-written for September, as is the way school shares this information with parents. Already a new feedback policy is in place and due to be launched in the Spring term, which focuses on children understanding exactly what they need to do to be successful and knowing their next steps so they can move their own learning forward.




Parents do feel the school ensures pupils are well behaved. 1 parent did disagree. Whilst improving children's learning behaviours to support them to become life-long learners, is still a focus, their behaviour has been observed to be very good. Since September one class has been taught by the Deputy Head teacher.




# Reedings Junior School Survey Results

## Q6: MY CHILD HAS BEEN BULLIED THIS TERM AND SCHOOL DEALT WITH THE BULLYING QUICKLY AND EFFECTIVELY



Most parents do not think their child has been bullied. Those who feel their child has been bullied, think the school has dealt with it. 1 parent in Year 3 and 1 in Year 6 disagrees. All reports of bullying made by an adult or child are logged on the school's internal tracking database and the head teacher gets an automated email as soon as an incident has been recorded. As of October all school staff have access to this system and can add a concern under any category. There have been no referrals of bullying or event of any concern regarding friendships from either of these classes.

## Q7: WHEN I HAVE RAISED CONCERNS WITH SCHOOL, THEY HAVE BEEN DEALT WITH PROPERLY




The majority of parents either have not raised concerns or feel the school deals with concerns properly in all bar 1 case in Year 6. All communication regarding children in this class have been reviewed and school staff are unable to identify who this parent may be.

The head teacher will continue to be present and available at the start and end of day at the gates for parents to approach were they to have any concerns.





## Q8: THE SCHOOL KEEPS ME INFORMED IN A TIMELY WAY (NEWSLETTERS, EMAILS, TEXTS)



93% of parents felt this was true in line with 88% of parents in Autumn 2019. The newsletters celebrate children's success as well as giving any notices or sharing key messages and the revival of the twitter account aims to keep parents in touch with school highlights in a timelier way. For any more urgent messages that cannot wait, the school will continue to text and email.

## Q9: I AM HAPPY WITH THE SCHOOL'S ENGAGEMENT WITH ME AS A PARENT




No parent is in disagreement with this and 91% agree this is the case.

**Q10: THE SCHOOL SUPPORTS MY CHILD'S WIDER PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT (PROVIDING EXPERIENCE AND OPPORTUNITIES TO DEVELOP THEIR BROADER INTERESTS...**



Most parents agree the school supports their child's wider development. The only additional clubs on offer have had to be run by school staff and outside only due to the pandemic. When non-school staff were unable to run clubs, teachers and support staff stepped in on a voluntary basis to ensure they could continue.
