Although the impact was not measured using summative data, barriers for children at Reedings are very pupil specific. Attendance is a barrier for ¼ of children and ¼ of children have Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs which will be addressed through mentoring and counselling. At least ½ came up from KS1 working below the age related expectation and several children have diagnosed SEN, 1 with an EHCP.
