On Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> February, we will be having our first theme day. Your children's well-being is a priority and we understand how hard the past few weeks have been, getting settled into new routines and a whole new way of learning. This theme day will be off timetable and an opportunity for children to take what they need. That may be a break altogether, a break from their usual routine to try some new theme based learning or this may be a chance to catch up on work missed.

## Activities:

- Create a game about internet safety
- Competition: create a poster about internet safety
- Two truths and a lie
