Here are your activities for the week beginning 13th July 2020.

As always, remember to **hand in your work on Purple Mash** so that teachers know you have finished. Simply click 'hand in' on the 2Dos section. You can also email your teacher via Purple Mash as we are enjoying finding out what you have been doing. Simply type '2email' in the search box in Purple Mash to open up your emails.

### **English**

For your last piece of writing, we would like you to write a letter to your next teachers, introducing yourself. We will send it to them so this is your chance to really impress.

Use your skills from when you created your story characters to describe:

- Clubs
- Anything else that you think they'd like to know!

You could even add a photograph of yourself!

There is a letter template 2do on Purple Mash which we would like you to use (write it on paper first and then type it up when it is perfect) so that we can print it for next year's teachers.

This week, we are linking our maths work to Whiterose as it fits with what we want you to learn. The Whiterose website breaks the work into daily lessons that you might find easier to follow. **Monday** – Lines of symmetry

**Tuesday** – Complete a symmetric figure

**Wednesday** – Describe a position

**Thursday** – Draw on a grid

**Friday** – Challenge of the week
